

An alternative sweet medicine for child patients









When children are admitted to hospital

They not only have to face the discomfort and pain from the illness, but also the difficulty to understand those medical procedures. Therefore, they will have anxiety and usually do not know how to face it. On the other hand, in facing the child's illness, parents will also worry a lot. If it is a chronic illness or a long-term hospitalization, their stress would be even increased.

In order to support the children to adapt to the life in hospital and face the stress of treatments, it is essential to have Hospital Play Service in paediatric wards. Research studies show that play can support good health and help us recover from a number of illnesses. Studies demonstrate that happiness enhances the activity of the body's Natural Killer (NK) cells to build up the immune system, and it can reduce the levels of stress related hormones. Play can bring happiness to children and support them to recover sooner.

Playright provided Hospital Play Service for Hong Kong in 1994. For the benefits of children, through different therapeutic play activities, the trained Hospital Play Specialists bring joy as well as playful and child-friendly environments to the hospitals. At the same time, they also support the children to face their treatments positively and thereby speed up their recovery rate. With positive support and continuous access to play even during illness, hospitalized children can just like other children have happiness through play!



Preparation Play

We prepare children psychologically for upcoming medical procedures and treatments in order to reduce their stress and anxiety, including operations, chemotherapy, hemodialysis, CT scan, blood taking and many others.



Therapeutic Play

We provide tailor-made play services to children and teenagers who are suffering from behavioral problems, eating disorders or child abuse for helping them to build up a more healthy and happy life in the future.



Patient Play Group

This play group established by hospital play specialists focuses on the voice of children. We encourage child patients to join the group for discovering their individual potential, promoting their self-values and developing strong mutual support for each other through different kinds of play activities.



Distraction Play

We help children cope with pain and anxiety during medical procedures by distracting them with interesting games and toys.



Playright Channel

Playright introduced Hong Kong's first ever interactive hospital television channel in 2006. A lively monthly variety and game show broadcast in paediatric wards gives every child, even those confined to isolation wards, a chance to play and communicate with children in other wards. It is a valuable means for children to have fun through play and receive the support from the community.



Little Star Project

We provide medical play workshops for pre-school and primary school children, helping them to understand more about hospitalization and encourage them to show their concern to child patients in hospitals.



Medical Play

Through medical toys, we provide children with opportunities to learn some medical knowledge and express their feelings towards their illness.



Home Visit

We provide a home visit service to children with serious illness, for example to children after renal transplantation who need to be isolated at home. Through the service, we let them still have chances to play and get emotional support from us. Besides, we can provide education for parents on how to communicate with their children through play.



Volunteer Play Service in Ward

Volunteers are a valuable resource for the hospital play service. They not only help us to provide play service for the hospitalized children, but advocate our mission and let the public know the importance of hospital play through their personal experiences.



Developmental Play

We provide appropriate play activities for children to have optimum psychological and psychosocial development during hospitalization.



Outreach Play Programmes

We provide different kinds of outreach play programmes regularly for children with chronic illness to let them enjoy the play opportunities and enhance mutual support from family members and others



Hospital Play Training & Workshop

Our professional hospital play specialists have visited many more hospitals to offer their expert opinion to the healthcare professionals and volunteers in the design and provision of appropriate play as well as the special skills needed when playing with children under medical care. Besides, we will provide related talks and courses to different nursing schools and health professional's associations by invitation.
